

RYPEN - CODE OF CONDUCT/COVID19 (Autumn)

2023

District 9920 RYPEN Organisers may have protocols in place that exceed the current Government COVID-19 mandated requirements at the time of RYPEN Camp. These will include:

- Students agree to be RATs Test upon arrival and at registration. For those not taking the provided transportation. The test will be conducted safely by members of the Rotary Club of Papakura.
- Students agree to support the organisers by abiding by any social distancing, hygiene and control measures they have in place.
- Students should immediately inform the Rotary organisers if they are not well before attending RYPEN Camp
- Everyone attending the RYPEN Camp must be prepared to submit to daily temperature checks which may take place daily on a random basis and where required further RAT tests
- Anyone who feels unwell at any time during the course of the RYPEN Camp must report immediately to the District Chair, Ainie Kwok.
- There may be a requirement for all students and volunteers to wear face masks and maintain social distancing. If it eventuates that this is the case, it is expected that all students and volunteers will comply. It is recommended that all students bring their own face masks, however the RYPEN Organising team will supply any supplemental face masks required.
- Hand sanitizers will be made available throughout the Camp
- Anyone who is deemed unwell or is not prepared to comply with the above will be sent home at the sole discretion of the RYPEN District 9920 Chair
- The camp will be subject to daily cleaning by a team of volunteers who will move through the whole complex to complete their task

Additional standard code of conduct rules include:

- Students and volunteers should treat the Kokako Lodge camp staff, the camp buildings and facilities, and the environment, with courtesy and respect
- Students and volunteers should treat each other with courtesy and respect.
- Students are expected to take full part in the camp programme and attend all sessions.
- Students and volunteers will remain in the camp at all times unless on programme outings.
- Students must not have a mobile phone on them during the camp. If you arrive with a mobile phone this MUST be handed in and can be safely stored by the organisers. This is a technology free weekend
- Students will not bring cars to the camp
- There will be no alcohol or drugs (except prescription) in the camp.
- Do not bring sharp objects that may cause harm
- There may not be any water based team building exercise which is weather dependent. This will be replaced by landbased session. This is due to the water at that time of the year being extremely cold down at the Falls and we can expect a lot of visitors down at the falls during the weekends. This will be strictly adhered to, and any breach of protocol will be strictly dealt with.

Administration of the Code

- All breaches of the Code of Conduct will be referred to the RYPEN 9920 Chair and be acted upon immediately by way of a meeting to discuss any further involvement in RYPEN

- The student involved will have the right to be heard, and to have representation.
- It is expected that a major breach of the Code of Conduct will result in the parents/guardians being notified and the student being sent home. The school and sponsoring club will be notified.
